- Rochester has the highest per capita population of deaf or hard-of-hearing adults younger than 65 in the nation
- The <u>Rochester School for the Deaf</u> opened in 1876.
- Fingerspelling became known as the "Rochester Method" letters are spelled out literally by hand.
- In 1968, RIT became home of the <u>National</u> <u>Technical Institute for the Deaf.</u>
- Rochester is home to several churches for the deaf community, and many area churches have deaf ministries.

 - History was made at the 2022 Oscars when CODA was named best picture and Troy Kotsur was the first deaf male actor to win an Oscar
